Online Talk on Benefits for 14 – 25 Year-olds

Lou Glencross will be talking about the benefits which parents and carers of children and young people with special educational needs or disabilities could be entitled to, as well as benefits for adults. The talk is part of the Surrey Welfare Rights Unit 'Moving To Adulthood' project.

It explains clearly the benefits available, and the information should help you obtain your maximum welfare benefit entitlements. It also contains help on where to go for more detailed information.

RESEARCH REQUESTS

Research on Need for Legal Advice for Families of Children

South West London Law Centres (SWLLC) defend the rights of people who can't afford a lawyer. They are based across 6 South West London boroughs, and offer free legal advice to people living in those boroughs through 'clinics' and some free legal representation through legal aid.

SWLLC have been researching access to legal advice services in Surrey, working with Citizen's Advice, universities and legal firms. They understand that advice around education rights is particularly limited and difficult to access. They want to talk to families who have struggled to access affordable legal support and to find out what sort of help they needed. This will help SWLLC to make the case for free legal advice to be available to Surrey families in future.

So far the Centre's research suggests that the issues which need to be covered are:

- Special Educational Needs (including advice on Education, Health and Care Plans, First Tier Tribunal Appeals, and enforceability of provision)
- Children out of school for reasons of illness, exclusion or otherwise - basic rights and entitlements
- School exclusions
- Disability discrimination in schools (including independent schools)
- School transport issues

The researcher, Eve Rogers, is keen to hear from families who have needed legal help with the problems listed above, and also from people who had other issues related to education in the recent past. If you have struggled to get legal advice about an issue related to your child's education, please contact Eve Rogers at eve.rogers@swllc.org or call 020 8208 5735 (Monday – Thursday) as soon as possible, and before the end of February.

Please note that Eve Rogers is researching the NEED for free legal advice in Surrey. She is not a lawyer and cannot answer legal questions herself.

Research into Uptake of Green Volunteering Opportunities

Organisations including Surrey Coalition of Disabled People (SCDP) and Surrey Youth Focus (SYF) are trying to find out why people from underrepresented communities are not taking up opportunities to volunteer in nature-based roles or organisations. They particularly want to contact young people (including those with learning difficulties), as well as:

- People from Minority Ethnic Communities
- People who experience mental ill-health
- Disabled people
- Carers

Research into Neurodiversity Diagnosis/Assessment for Under 18s

Healthwatch Surrey gathers the views of local people on health and social care services in the county.

They have a new project called *Neurodiversity - Value of Assessment* which aims to assess what value there will be (or what benefit there was), for young people aged 17 and under in having an assessment and/or diagnosis for neurodiversity. They want to know what people hope an assessment / diagnosis will achieve or change and to see if that is what happens in reality.

Healthwatch would like to interview 20 young people aged 17 and under who have either been referred for assessment for neurodiversity and are waiting for their assessment, OR who have been assessed since January 2021. Parents/carers can remain with their young person or could be interviewed instead if preferred.

The young people can be of primary or secondary age, with or without other conditions, from anywhere in Surrey. You can take part, whether or not your young person received a diagnosis after the assessment. Healthwatch are also interested to hear from families who paid for a private assessment.

The interviews will take place during February and will last about 45 minutes, mostly face to face, but they are happy to accommodate individual needs. All information given will be kept anonymous. There is a £40 'thank you' gift per interview. Please note - Because they need to cover a diverse range of circumstances, it might not be possible to interview everyone who volunteers.

INFORMATION FOR ADULTS, YOUNG PEOPLE AND THEIR FAMILIES

NAS Autism Insight Panels

The NAS has set up autism insight panels to ensure that all its work is informed by the views of the people they support, and their supporters.

There are three panels: one for autistic people, one for parents and carers of autistic people, and one for people who work in the field of autism or support autistic people in their work.

You can join the panels to help inform the NAS' work, give your views on our messages and the visuals they want to use, shape campaigns and help them to understand the issues you and your family are facing and where you think they should focus their efforts.

If you join a panel, you will be contacted by email at least every three months (sometimes more regularly) with short questions such as your thoughts on a campaign, or to track your view on how autism is perceived by the public.

From time to time, they will also contact you to ask whether you want to take part in other types of insight, such as focus groups.

New Day Service for Adults with Learning Disabilities in Walton

Elmbridge Mencap is running a new day service for adults with learning disabilities (not only with autism) on Mondays, Tuesday & Thursdays from 9.45am - 3.45pm. Full or half day sessions are available.

The sessions cost £40 for a half day or £75 for a full day (both including lunch).

The facilities at Burview Hall include:

- A large hall with interactive floor and surround sound
- Two sensory rooms and games room,
- A sensory garden
- A secure woodland area.
- Fully accessible building with large car park

A variety of activities will be offered such as gardening, cookery, arts & crafts, games, music & movement, sensory room sessions and life skills. Day service users will be involved in cooking their own lunch.

Those who require 1:1 support can bring their PAs along.
